


















"Everything I Do"











CONGRATULATIONS to all the football players for another Championship season, and especially for setting a school record of Back-to-Back District Championships.






1997-1998 BOYS BASKETBALL



At the 40th Grammy awards, Shawn Colvin walked away with Record of the Year and Song of the Year for Sunny Came Home. 4. Erykah Badu won a Grammy for Female Rhythm and Blues Vocal performance with her song On and On. Her album Baduizm won a Grammy for Rhythm and Blues Album. 5. The Florida-based group Matchbox 20's debut album, Yourself or Someone Like You, sold more than four million copies. 6. Jamiroquai, known for its unique sound and lead singer Jay Kay's Suessinspired hats, won a Grammy for its song Virtual Insanity. 7. Fiona Apple's debut album Tidal brought the 20-year old artist great success and a Grammy. 8. Garth Brooks gave a free concert in New York City's Central Park and drew hundreds of thousands of fans. His album Sevens sold 3.4 million copies between Thanksgiving and New Years.

The base ink colors were black with special effects created using percentages of black. Printing was done on 7 3/4 X 10 1/2 paper.


The book contains 2 pages of full color for senior portraits and 2 page 4 color tip-in for prom.


Headlines were 24 pt., subheadlines 18 pt., body copy 10 pt., capitions 8 pt. Type style was Times Roman.




