





The Thayer Flyers began their 1998 football season on Monday, August 17th. Coach Minor and Coach Nevvin welcomed eighteen young men to the start of a new football season. The team was led by one senior, six juniors, three sophomores, and seven freshmen.

After a disappointing 0-5 start, the Flyers won three of their last four games. The Flyer's first defeat was Oswego 36-22. As district play began, the Flyers defeated Elk Valley 22-18, setting up a chance on the last game of the season to defeat Arch-rival Altoona-Midway and win their district for the third year in a row. On October 29, the Flyers did travel to Altoona and won 28-8, to win the District Championship.

The Flyers were disappointed by only having two players selected to the all-league team. Those receiving honors were Nathan Stafford, second team linebacker, and Seth Minor, Honorable Mention safety.

Congratulations to all the football players for another championship season and especially for setting a school record of back-to-back-to-back District Champions!

Coach Vern Minor was honored to have been selected as one of the coaches to coach in the 8-man All Star game in Beloit on Saturday, June 5, 1999.



1998-99 BOYS BASKETBALL

The 1998-99 season finished with an outstanding record of 18-7. The team received second place in the Marmaton Valley Pre-Season Tournament, the Pleasanton Mid-Season Tournament, the Mineral Belt Conference, Regionals, and Sub-State. The Flyers averaged 67.4 points on offense and allowed only 52.3 points on defense. Three members of the team made All-Conference: Layton McCoy, Blake Rousselle, and Paul Hughes. The three seniors, Layton McCoy, Nathan Stafford, and Kevin Powers provided great leadership.

Several games stand out as great victories, but the greatest was probably Pittsburgh-St. Mary's Colgan game where the Flyers rallied in the second half,

when down by eighteen, to win by five. Colgan only lost three games all year and ended up third in the State in Class 2A.

The JV team finished 11-8 and the Freshmen 3-1. The JV won the Altoona Tournament and took second at the Elk Valley Tournament. The Freshmen took second at the Thayer Tournament. "I really enjoyed coaching the team this year. They're a great bunch of young men of outstanding character and work ethic, and overall just plain fun to be with. We set our goals high for the season. We wanted to make it to state, but came one game short. That's all right because you won't achieve much without setting high goals."



1999 BASEBALL

The Flyers of 1999 had a T.H.S. record setting season. Heading to the State Tournament for the second year (9th overall) in a row the Flyers boast a 19 and 2 record. That beats the 18-5 record of 1996.

Highlights for the season were winning the Arma Tournament and winning the MBL Championship for the first time. The Flyers also were the MBL Tournament Champs. The biggest thrill came on May 18, as the Flyers traveled to West Elk High School where they defeated Altoona-Midway 10-0 and West Elk 12-5 to win the Regional Championship for the ninth time to advance to the State Tournament in Emporia on May 28-29.

Leading the Flyers in hitting were Jake Holtzman, .528; Michael Duff, .429; Seth Minor, .521; and Preston Whittley, .403. The leading pitchers were Blake Rousselle with a 9-0 record with an ERA of .174 and Jason Wheeler with 7-0 and an ERA of 2.27. All-League honors went to Seth Minor, Jake Holtzman, Preston Whittley, Blake Rousselle, Jason Wheeler, Paul Hughes, and Michael Duff with Dale Stafford receiving Honorable Mention.






