The Last Page

This school year started out much like the last one ended. . . full of uncertainty and frustration at the political workings of CUSD #101. Lawsuits, lawyers, the State Board of Education, committees, campaigns, elections, and a three-way community tug-of-war for control of the fate of our school pervaded the conversations of high school and junior high students. "Where will you go to school next year?" was the question most often asked of our students whether at home, at school activities, or at Wal-Mart.

An all-out election campaign war ensued when the anti-consolidation groups sought to overturn the balance of power on the local school board by supporting encumbant Steve Wheeler, St. Paul representative Michael Beachner, and write-in candidate Paul Westhoff. Wheeler and Beachner won, but Westhoff's opponent, Jim Dyson, was declared the winner of that position. Westhoff requested a recount, and two weeks later, Paul Westhoff was declared the winner due to an error in calculations at the county clerk's office. But, once again, the vote was not final. Jim Dyson filed an appeal on the grounds of election fraud claiming dishonesty by poll workers in Thayer. On Thursday, May 19th, Judge "Buck" Lyle found no evidence to support throwing out the election. Paul Westhoff would claim the seat in July returning the school board to a non-consolidation majority.

It would seem that things were headed in the right direction, but in the midst of the election proceedings, the State Board of Education, in an unprecedented move, voted to allow the St. Paul school district and facilities to join up with USD #505 in Chetopa, Kansas--40 miles away. Now, the question arises as to whether the St. Paul board members, Scott Smith and Michael Beachner, would be allowed to serve out their terms since they no longer live in District #101. As of June 20th, yet another lawsuit had been filed by Erie and Galesburg patrons to prevent them

from serving their terms of office.

Students and staff at Thayer High School were asked to continue in the education process as if everything was fine, when in reality, education was the farthest thing from their minds. Every sentence was prefaced with either, "If we have a school next year. . ." or "In the event that we don't have a school next year, you need to . . ." Teachers were faced with the choice of staying on and being reassigned as needed throughout the district, or with moving on. Two high school teachers, Cathy Medford and Sheryl McCoy, were given notice of non-renewal of their contracts due to reduction-in-force.

Lorraine Kilgore and Virginia Francisco decided to retire. Jim Wagner and I made the decision to move to another school district—Jim to Parsons and me to Neodesha. Tim Seibel, Vern Minor, and Wilda Cross decided to hang in and see what happens.

The Thayer community is still looking for solutions for keeping the high school open. Whether it be transferring to another district or trying to work within the CUSD #101 system, the community has made a commitment to keep fighting until there are no options left. On behalf of the students and staff, we would like to thank the Thayer community for its willingness to fight for the school, putting their personal pursuits on hold for the sake of the kids. In the words of Kayla Aikins, 2005 Senior Class Valedictorian, in her graduation address, "It will never be said that Thayer

High School went down without a fight." See next years yearbook for the rest of the story. . .
